## K-8 DRESS CODE

**Uniforms are mandatory for all BST K-8 students**

## Benefits of School Uniforms

There are many positive reasons for uniforms, including:
$\checkmark$ Prepare students for the real world because most entry-level jobs require uniforms. This is good practice.
$\checkmark$ Prepare students to get ready for $21^{\text {st }}$ Century Careers by demonstrating a neat business-like image.
$\checkmark \quad$ Create a sense of school pride and belonging while being less expensive.
$\checkmark$ Encourage students to focus on personal growth and academic achievement, not outward appearances.
$\checkmark$ Create a strong learning environment with fewer discipline problems and are less likely to be distracting to students.
$\checkmark$ Minimize the visible socioeconomic differences between children and eliminate pressure to wear brand-name clothing.

## Listing of Acceptable Clothing

Bottoms: Navy, Black, or Khaki/Tan (solid color)
$\checkmark$ Bermuda-style shorts, slacks, skorts, skirts, athletic shorts, or jumpers.
$\checkmark$ Leggings/tights can only be worn under approved bottoms, not by themselves, even on dress-down days.
$\checkmark$ All bottoms, including leggings/tights, must be plain, solid dress-code color (No fishnets).
$\checkmark$ Black Sweatpants/Joggers (loose fitting) with pockets are allowed. Logos must be less than one square inch.

## Tops: POLOS Forest Green, Kelly Green, Navy Blue, Light Blue (solid color)

## K-8 T-shirts in Kelly Green or Navy

$\checkmark \quad$ May be long or short sleeves.
$\checkmark$ Polos do not require a school logo.
$\checkmark$ Undershirts (if worn) must be plain, solid dress-code color without hoods.
$\checkmark$ Polo shirts can be purchased at www.TheSoar.Store online or at www.frenchtoast.com (source code: QS44B3M) with or without the school logo. Polo shirts can also be purchased at other department stores without logo but must meet dresscode guidelines. Non-school logos on polos must be less than one square inch.

## Other Rules for Appropriate Dress

$\checkmark$ A belt must be worn if bottoms are oversized and/or show undergarments.
$\checkmark$ Skirts, jumpers, shorts, and polo-style dresses must be either mid-thigh or fingertip in length based on the stature of the student and will be addressed on an individual basis.
$\checkmark \quad$ Shoes must be closed-toe, closed-heel, and safe for walking (NO Crocs nor slides).

## Physical Education \& Yoga Uniforms

$\checkmark$ Black gym shorts/athletic pants (solid color) are recommended for PE/YOGA days.
$\checkmark$ Tennis shoes/sneakers/athletic shoes must be worn on PE/YOGA days.

## Exceptions to the BST Uniform Dress Code

$\checkmark$ Only when granted by the administration for activities such as Reward Days, Color Bash, Holidays, etc.
$\checkmark$ Only when granted by the administration for a reasonable accommodation.
$\checkmark$ Clothing should not contain logos, slogans, markings, or words.

## List of Unacceptable Clothing

$\times$ Jeans and/or denim jeans material is not allowed.
$\times$ Shoes must not have wheels or other moving parts.
$\times$ Clothing too tight or too loose is not allowed- no skinny jeans, tight pants, or jeggings.
$\times$ Clothing must not be see-through or have tears/holes.
$\times$ Hats, sunglasses, and hoods on sweatshirts may not be worn inside school buildings.
$\times$ Any item with political wording or logos.
$\times$ Volleyball shorts are not to be worn for PE/YOGA, the only exception is for practices and games.

## List of Unacceptable Clothing for Approved Dress-down Days

$\times$ Mini-shirts, mini-dresses, halters, backless shirts or dresses, tube tops, tank tops without a shirt, spaghetti straps, midriff outfits, and see-through garments.
$\times \quad$ Clothing with tears or holes.
$\times$ Leggings/tights can only be worn under approved bottoms, not by themselves, even on dress-down days.
$\times$ Undergarments designed as clothing or sleepwear, such as boxer shorts, tights, hosiery, pajama pants or pajama shorts.
$\times$ Any item that contains logos, slogans, markings, or words that are not appropriate for school or business.
$\times$ No clothing from other middle/high schools. College and pro sports teams are acceptable.
$\times \quad$ Sweatpants with no holes or tears are allowed on dress-down days.
$\times \quad$ Shoes must be closed-toe, closed-heel, and safe for walking (No Crocs or slides), even on dressdown days.

## Winter/Cold Days

On very cold days ( 50 degrees or below) students who walk, bike, or wait for the bus etc. may need to wear sweatpants or coats over their school uniform on their way to/from school. However, any clothing that doesn't meet dress code requirements must be removed while in school buildings or classrooms. Jeans will not be permitted unless announced for dress-down day.

## If students are cold in buildings/classrooms outer clothing must meet the following:

$\checkmark$ Must be a sweater, sweatshirt, jacket, or blazer.
$\checkmark \quad$ Must be solid forest green, navy blue or black.
$\checkmark$ Must only have BST logo or a logo less than one square inch.
$\checkmark$ Students must have a collared polo uniform shirt or school shirt underneath a sweater, sweatshirt, jacket, or blazer.

BST staff will determine if clothing is appropriate and compliant with BST dress code. BST staff reserves the right to ask a student to remove non-dress code attire and change into clothing that meets the dress code.

## Violations of dress code requirements

Note: After a student's 4th dress code violation, the violation becomes insubordination with its consequences. Parent contact begins at the 3rd violation. Adjustments will be made for our younger students.
